

LOCAL LEADERS ARE AT THE FRONTLINE OF FIGHTING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC.


They are making the tough choices and hard decisions to ensure the health, safety and welfare of their communities.



Taking Action

Even if it means raising taxes, 80% of residents still want to see their local government help control the spread of COVID-19 and support those most affected by the virus



Methodology

This poll was conducted by Morning Consult between March 17 - 20, 2020 among a national sample of 2,200 U.S. adults. The interviews were conducted online, and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of U.S. adults based on age, educational attainment, gender, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of +/- 2%.
